Leaving Certificate Applied 2011/12

This term has been extremely busy for Leaving Certificate Applied students. They have been working on **three tasks** since September: 1 **IT task** - based on Claymation and movie making. The students made clay figures of Alice in Wonderland, took digital photos of the scenes and have made movies of the story using movie maker.

2. **Contemporary Issues:** students studied and researched topics such as prison life, child abuse, drugs, alcohol and did posters, leaflets, surveys etc on the topics.

3. **Practical Achievement Task:** students chose a skill they wanted to learn e.g. learning to drive, gel nail, first aid, dancing etc and attended classes for a number of weeks.


